Hanover, July 29, N. S.

ON Tuesday the 26th the Lord Waldegrave arrived at Clauffhall at One a Clock in the Morning from Vienna, and was very graciously received by the King. After Dinner the King went to Altenaw, a Town upon the Hartz, where there is a Copper-Mine, and returned that Night to Clauffhall. In the Evening General Diemar set out for Cassel. On Wednesday the 27th in the Morning, His Majesty went to Selersfeldt to see the Coinage of the Mines, which are enjoyed in common between him and the Duke of Wolfenbuttel; and having returned to Clauffhall, and dined there, set out in the Afternoon for Osterode, where he arrived that Evening. Yesterday the 28th, the King set out from Osterode at Nine in the Morning for Hertzberg, another Town upon the Hartz, about two Leagues from thence, in the Neighbourhood of which Place he was diverted with hunting the Stag, and returned to Osterode at Six in the Evening in perfect Health; and this Morning he was to set out for Munden, where he designs to lie to Night.

Hague, Aug. 2. The Prince of Auvergne Archbishop of Vienne in Dauphine, with his Brother Prince Henry, Prebendary of the Cathedral of Strasburg, arrived here some Days ago from France: They were Yesterday magnificently entertained at Dinner by the Earl of Chesterfield. Those two Princes will stay here three or four Months to attend a Law-

Suit, concerning the Marquifate of Bergen-op-zoom, which they have with the Prince of Sulzbach, and which is to be decided here by the Tribunal called the Chamber of Brabant. The Prince of Baden Dourlach is arrived at his Father's the Margrave of Baden Dourlach's Country-house near Haerlem, from whence they will go in a Day or two to Soefdyck, to make a Visit to the Prince of Orange, and the Princess Dowager his Mother, to whose Daughter the said Prince of Dourlach is married; and after a short Stay there, they will return to Baden, their Estate, by going up the Rhine in a fine Yacht belonging to them. The Prince of Orange having made an End of his Studies at the University of Utrecht, left that Place on the 31st past, and went to Soefdyck, where the Princess his Mother resides, from whence he will soon go to Loo (a fine Country Seat which he inherited from his late Majesty King William) and then to Friesland, of which Province he is hereditary Stadthouder.
