## Hanover, August 2, N. S.

Nine in the Morning, the King fet out from Offerode, and arrived at Three in the Afternoon at Munden, where He was received with the greatest Demon-firations of Joy. His Majesty reviewed that Day a Regiment of Foot of His own Troops, which was quartered there; and the fame Afternoon Prince William and Prince George of Helle, with Brigadier Sutton and General Diemar, waited on His Majefty with an Ac-count of the Difpolitions that were made for His Majesty's reviewing the Hessian Troops in His Pay. On Saturday the 30th the King went from Munden at Eight in the Morning, and was met on the Road about Nine by his most Serene Highnels the Landgrave of Hesse, at the Place appointed for His Majefty's leaving His Coach and getting on Horfeback : After the Ceremony of their Meeting was over, His Majeily advanced towards the Right Wing of the Army, which was drawn out in one Line of Battle at the Head of their Camp, on a Plain near Caflel : When His Majefty arrived at a certain Diftance from the Line, a Signal was given by Rockets for a triple Difcharge of the Artillery in the Camp, and from the Ramparts of the Town, which ended exactly as His Majefty came upon the Right Wing of the Line; where the King was received by Prince William, and the Ge-neral Officers of that Wing, at the Head of the King of Sweden's Regiment of Dragoons. His Majesty passed along the Line, being saluted in the ufual manner; after which His Majesty went to a magnificent Tent, pitched for that Purpole in the Centre of the Line, where the Princels of Helle, and a great Number of Ladies who were there, had the Honour of being presented to His Majefty : The Troops then marched off from the Right, and paffed by His Majesty, the Horse and Dragoons by Fours, confiiting of Twenty Squadrons, and the Foot by Sub-Divisions, confifting of Eleven Batallions, and they being returned to their Ground, His Majefty was pleafed to fee the Foot perform their

Exercife, which they began upon the Signal given by one Cannon, and went through the whole without any further Signals or Word N Friday last, the 29th of July, about | of Command ; other Signals being then given for their Firings, they went through the whole with such Readiness, Order and Exactnels, as gave His Majesty entire Satis-faction; then His Majesty got on Horseback again, and having paffed a fecond Time along the Line to a Bridge of Boats laid over the River for that Purpole, went to the Oran-gerie in the Suburbs of Callel, where His Majefty and His whole Company were fplendidly entertained at Dinner by his Highnels. About Eight a-Clock in the Evening His Majefty left that Place on His Return to Munden, under a triple Salvo of all the Cannon from the Ramparts and the Camp, each of which was followed by a Feu de Joye. of the whole Army, drawn up again for that Purpose. The Landgrave and Prince William accompanied the King Part of His Way to Munden, where His Majefty arrived at Ten that Night, and refted there on Sun-day the 31ft. Yefterday the King went from Munden to Neuen-Over, to fee His Studd of Her(fer and lex left Niet et Pa Studd of Horles, and lay last Night at Rothenkirchen, and this Afternoon His Majesty returned to Herrenhaulen in perfect Health. The Lord Townshend and Lord Waldegrave, came back this Evening to Hanover, as did alfo Count Kinski and feveral other foreign Ministers. On the 30th of July in the Evening M. Chavigni arrived from Ratisbon, being fent hither by his moft Christian Majesty, to negociate his Affairs at this Court.
