Lunenburg, August 19, N. S.

**Y**esterday the King reviewed four Battallions of Foot. After his Majesty had rode along the Line, and dismounted at the Tent, the Regiments marched by Companies before his Majesty, and ranked off Man by Man. They then marched to their former Ground, and performed their manual Exercise and Facings. This done, they formed two Lines, and fired by Platoons and Divisions at each other, advancing and retreating. After which they perform'd the Hollow Square and fired, the Grenadiers throwing Grenadoes. They then reduced the Square, drew up again in one Line, and fired in Platoons. Their Exercise being over, they marched by his Majesty in grand Divisions, which finished the Review. This Day the King reviewed four other Battallions of Foot, who went through the whole Exercise in the same Manner as those Yesterday; which Exercise was performed both Days with great Regularity.

*Ghorde, Aug. 20.* About Eight this Morning the King set out from Lunenburg, and was saluted by a triple Discharge of the Artillery from the Ramparts; about Eleven his Majesty arriv'd at this Place, in perfect Health, where he proposes to spend seven or eight Days, and 'tis thought will then go from hence to Zell, there to stay three or four more.

*Hague, Aug. 26, N. S.* The Grand Pensionary continues very ill of the Gout, which is got up to his Stomach, so that he has not been able to attend any Business for some Days past. As he has already escaped several of the like Fits, it is hoped that he will likewise get well over this. The Earl of Chesterfield, who has been lately very ill of an Ague and Fever, is now well recovered. M. Afsendelft, who is to go in a few Days to Bruffels as Resident from this Republick, has been named Receiver of the Subsidies of the Towns and Places of West-Flanders (an Employment which also the late Resident M. Peffers had) and this Morning has taken the proper Oaths for that Office. The States General having some Suspensions that the Algerines will disturb the Trade of their Sub-

jects in the Mediterranean, have this Day sent Orders to their Admiral M. Somellidjck, now lying at Spithead, to detach forthwith three Men of War for Algiers, to have a watchful Eye to the Cruizers of that Government.
