**O**N Wednesday the 31st past a Play was acted before His Majesty and a very numerous Court, in the Gallery at Herrenhausen. Yesterday Baron Stein, Privy-Councillor and Minister of the Margrave of Brandenburg-Bareith, was introduced to his Majesty: Baron von Schade, Colonel of the Hessian Guards, who arrived here the Day before, from the Prince of Darmstadt, was also introduced to His Majesty; and both were very graciously received. This Night a very fine Firework will be played off behind the Gardens at Herrenhausen.

*Whitehall, August 29.*

His Majesty's Ship the *Feverham*, Captain Smith Commander, is arrived at Spithead. She left Port-Royal in Jamaica the 10th of June last, having under her Convoy 48 Sail of Merchant Ships. There was then no Talk there of any Invasion from the Spaniards. The Imbargo was taken off Eight Days before they failed; and was to be suspended Ten Days.
