Paris, September 21, N. S.

GREAT Preparations are making for the Reception of the Queen at Paris in the Beginning of November. After having visited the Churches of Notre Dame and St. Genevieve, her Majesty will dine and see a Ball at the Town-House, and at her leaving the Town there will be a fine Firework played off upon the River between the new Bridge and the Bridge Royal. The Marchioness de Peze is dead in Childbed. It is said the Marquess d'Alincourt, Second Son to the Duke de Villeroy, will be made Duke and Peer of France. The Office of Inspector of the Cavalry, vacant by the Death of M. de Bouteville, is given to M. de St. Andre la Bastie Governour of Die. On the 24th Instant the Fathers of the Oratory opened their General Chapter, where M. Herault the Lieutenant General de Police assisted as Commissioner on the Part of the King. The Cessions made by the Duke de Mazarin of his Dutchies and Estates, in Favour of his Son the Duke de la Maillaraye, have been confirmed.

Hague, Sept. 23. The Prince of Nassau Orange being entered into his Eighteenth Year the Beginning of this Month, and thereby come of Age to be installed Stadthouder of Groningen and the Ommelands; he accordingly made his Entry on the 15th Instant into the Town of Groningen, where he was received and declared Stadthouder by the States and People of that Province with great Solemnity and Rejoycings, after having taken the proper Oaths for that Dignity. Great Preparations are also making at Zutphen, to receive and install his Highness there, as Stadthouder of the Province of Gueldres. The Grand Pensionary who has had another severe Attack of the Gout, is upon the mending Hand.
