## Vienna, August 31, N. S.

UNDAY the 28th Inftant being the Anniverlary of her Imperial Ma-Demonstrations of Joy. There was a fine Confort of Mulick during the Dinner, and about Four in the Afternoon there was a Serenade at the Palace; which lafted till Eight at Night; after which all the Com-pany met in the Empress's Apartment, where a very magnificent Supper was ferved up, at which the Emperour, Empress, and the three Archdutchelles their Children, together with the Archdutchels Mary Mag-dalen Sifter to the Emperour, and the Duke of Lorrain, were prefent.
