Paris, September 28, N.S.

H E States of Languedoc will be held the 20th of next Month at Nisines. The Deputies of the Republick of Tripoli are returned home. M. de Romigni, and the Abbot Parquet, are named Grand Vicars to the Archbishop of Paris. A Commission of eight Masters of Requests, and the Grand Almoner of France, is appointed for the Relief of poor Debtors.

Dublin Castle, September 13.

This Morning arrived his Excellency the Lord Carteret, Lord Lieutenant of this Kingdom. He was received at his landing by the Lords Justices and several of the Nobility, as also by the Lord Mayor and Sheriffs of Dublin. The Forces in Garrison here, and the Militia of this City lined the Streets through which his Excellency, attended by a Regiment of Horse, the Battle-Ax Guards and other Officers attending the State, proceeded to the Castle, where there was a numerous Appearance to compliment him upon his safe Arrival.

Dublin Castle, September 16.
The Lord Lieutenant having this Day received the good News of His Majesty's safe Arrival in Great Britain, the Great Guns at the Barracks were fired by his Excellency's Order, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrison here. And his Excellency having sent Notice for that Purpose to the Lord Mayor of this City, the Evening

concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, Ringing of Bells, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.
