THE States of the Province of Holland will assemble To-morrow, the greatest Part of the Members being already in Town. Most of the Deputies of Gelderland are gone to assist at their provincial Assembly, which is to meet the 12th Instant, when the Prince of Nassau Orange is to be admitted to the Exercise of his Stadholdership of that Province: His Highness is to take an Oath in the Assembly, and afterwards to be entertained at a publick Dinner. The William and Mary Yacht is arrived at Helvoetsluys, in order to carry over the Countess of Albemarle to England. The Lady Whitworth is to be married next Sunday to the Count de Vaugrenant, in the Chappel of M. de la Baune the French Minister here, by the Archbishop of Vienne M. de Rychenbach Minister of the King of Prussia; passed through this Place the 2d Instant for Helvoetsluys, designing to pass over to England in the Packet-Boat.
