Which Rejoycings were continued the 28th by a Supper and Ball, and were to be concluded a third Night with a Masquerade.

Bruffels, Oct. 5, N. S. The States of Flanders have, as is usual about this Time, granted their annual Subfidy for the next Year 1730. On the 29th path Count Albert took Posselion of the Lordship of Grimberg, as Prince of Berghes, and gave a fplen-did Entertainment on that Occasion, at which a great Number of Persons of Quality were present.
