Vienna, September 21, N. S.

M. Braue the Minister of Wolfenbuttel at this Court, had Audience of the Emperour on the 18th Instant, to notify the Duke his Master's having been named one of the Arbitrators for accommodating the Differences between their Britannick and Prussian Majesties. Deputations from the Dyet in Hungary having of late been pretty frequent, the Emperour has thought fit to forbid any more from coming, and has limited the Session of that Dyet to the End of this Month. Their Imperial Majesties set out this Afternoon for Halburn, a Hunting Seat, accompanied by the Duke of Lorrain: Prince Eugene and Count Sinzen-dorf are to follow them in two or three Days. The Court will return hither on the 30th, in order to celebrate the Emperour's Birth-Day, which is the first of next Month. Banners the French Courier, who brought hither the News of the Birth of the Dauphin, has received from the Emperour a Present of a Gold Chain and Medal valued at 200 Ducats. M. de Buffy the French Secretary here, will dispatch back the said Courier in a Day or two.

Hague, October 4, N. S. The States have an Account that the Subdelegates in East-Friseland have received Orders from the Court of Vienna to suspend their Proceedings upon

the Differences there. A Yacht is sent to Brussels to bring hither the Earl of Denbigh and his Lady, who are to lodge at Count Welden's. General Keppel is expected here from Gelderland next Week. Letters from Hambourg of the 30th past advise, that Brigadier Sutton being returned thither from Copenhagen on the 26th, set out from thence on the 28th, intending to proceed by the Way of Hanover for England. The French Envoy at Hambourg had given a very magnificent Entertainment on the 25th, to all the foreign Ministers and Persons of Distinction residing in that City, on Occasion of the Birth of the Dauphin. Which Rejoycings were continued the 28th by a Supper and Ball, and were to be concluded a third Night with a Masquerade.

Brussels, Oct. 5, N. S. The States of Flanders have, as is usual about this Time, granted their annual Subsidy for the next Year 1730. On the 29th past Count Albert took Possession of the Lordship of Grimberg, as Prince of Berghes, and gave a splendid Entertainment on that Occasion, at which a great Number of Persons of Quality were present. The Prince and his Consort were received and conducted to their Castle by four Companies of the Inhabitants of that Lordship under Arms. And at Night a Firework was played off. The Celebration of the Emperour's Birth-day, which was on the 1st Instant, having been put off to the 3d, it was then kept with great Splendor.
