**T**HE Elector of Cologne arrived in the Bishoprick of Hildesheim last Saturday, with Count Plettenberg, and a small Retinue. The Elector having expressed an Inclination to see the Hartz some Day of this Week, the Duke of Wolfenbuttel has ordered Baron Stain and M. Wedderkop, with several of his Officers, to repair thither, to entertain his Electoral Highness and shew him the Mines.

Hague, Oct. 11, N. S. M. de la Baune the French Minister here, entertained Yesterday at Dinner all the foreign Ministers, with other Persons of Distinction, to the Number of fifty, at two Tables of 25 Covers each, which were very magnificently served, in order to celebrate the Birth of the Dauphin. This Evening his House was finely illuminated, Fireworks were lett off before his House, and Wine was distributed to the Populace, of which Wine there were two Fountains running. To-morrow Night he is to give a great Ball, to which all the Persons of Distinction are invited. The States General have sent Orders to their Admiral Somersdyke at Spithead, to return Home with the Squadron under his Command, they being victualled no longer than for this Month. Yesterday Brigadier Sutton arrived here from Copenhagen, he will stay here some Days to wait for Orders from his Majesty, either to return to Cassel, or to go to England.
