#### Hague, October 14, N. S.

N the 12th at Night M. de la Baune the French Minister's Entertainments for the Birth of the Dauphin, were concluded by a Supper and a Ball. This Day the Allembly of the States of the Province of Holland adjourned for fome Weeks. M. Hop, one of their High Mightineffes Plenipotentiaries for the Congress at Soiflons, has obtained Leave to return hither for two Months about his pri-vate Affairs. M. Allendelst, who has been fome time appointed Refident of this Repub-lick at Bruffels, fet out from hence the 11th Inftant to repair thither. The fame Day Baron Dehn set out for Wolfenbuttel, upon Advice of his Brother's being dangerously ille Count Zinzendorf had a Conference on the 6th Instant with the Deputies of the States General, to complain of Force used by the Dutch Garrisons in the Austrian Nether-lands, to recover some of their Deferters who had taken Sanctuary in the Churches there. The States on their Part have often been obliged to complain to the Government of those Netherlands that fuch taking Sanctu-ary by their Deferters was permitted, defiring Redrefs. M. Bellanger, the Elector of Cologne's Secretary, arrived here fome Days ago.

#### Kenfington, October 11.

This being the Anniversary of their Majefies Coronation, there was a numerous and splendid Appearance at Court of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction. At Noon the Guns in St. James's Park and at the Tower were fired ; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, Ringing of Bells, and all publick Demonfirations of Joy throughout London and Weftminster.

On the 30th paft the Chapter of Landaff elected the Reverend Dr. John Harris Bifhop of that See, by Virtue of His Majefty's Congé d'Elire, in the Room of the Right Reverend Dr. Clavering translated to the Bifhoprick of Peterborough.

### Tower-Division.

W Hereas it was published in the Coffee-Houfe Morning Post of the 24th of September laft, that a Gentleman well skill'd in the Management of a Theatre, is obtaining Letters Patents to erect one in Ayliffe-fireet in Goodmans-Fields, by Way of Subscription, and that the Undertaking meets with a general Approbation. And allo by an Advertifement published in the Daily Post of the 30th of the fame Month, it appears that only feven or eight Perfons have applied to the Juffices against erecting the faid Theatre, but that there has been no Meeting about it. These are therefore to certify, that the erecting the faid Theatre is fo far from meeting with a general Approbation, that great Numbers of Gentlemen and fubftantial Merchants and Tradefimen refiding in and near the faid Street, have applied to His Majefly's Juffices of the Peace asting for the Division of the Tower, at feveral Meetings appointed for that Purpose, and fet forth to them the evil Confequences that will neceffarily attend the carrying on fuch a Defign. The Juffices prefent at those Meetings were fo thoroughly convinced, that the erecting the faid Theatre fo near feveral publick Offices, and the Thames, where fo much Busines is negociated and carried on for the Support of Trade and Navigation, will draw away Tradefimens Servants and others from their lawful Callings, and cor-
