HE Speech made by the Right Honourable the Lord Chancellour to Sir Ralph Gore, when the Commons, having unanimously chosen him to be their Speaker, presented him Yesterday to the Lord-Lieutenant seated on the Throne in the House of Peers, for his Excellency's Approbation.

Mr. Chancelleur of the Exchequer,

HIS Excellency is extreamly concerned,
that the long and faithful Services of
the late Speaker should have so far impaired his Health at this Time, as to make him decline an Office, which he has filled for ma-

ny Years with great Honour.

The Publick might have suffered very much on this Occasion, had not the Commons chose one to succeed him, whose Integrity and perfect Knowledge in Parliamentary Affairs they had fully experienced: And the Unanimity they have shewn in this Election, ought to fatisfy you, that what you mention of your own Infufficiency, arises only from a modest Diffidence, which usually

attends the greatest Abilities.

Your known and constant Affection to His Majesty and His Royal Family, your Regard to the true Interest of the Kingdom, and the Capacity you have already shewn in publick Business, leave no Room to doubt, but you will fill the Chair with Credit and Reputation: And the Eminence and Difficulty of the Post which might be a Load on others, will only give you a better Opportunity of shewing those great Talents which you are Master of, and of exerting them in carrying on more effectually His Majesty's and the publick Service.

It is therefore His Excellency's Pleasure to confirm the Choice of the Commons, and to approve of you to be their Speaker.
