A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

Whereas our Parliament stands prorogued to the Twentieth Day of this Instant November; we, with the Advice of our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, That the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said Twentieth Day of this Instant November, to Tuesday the Thirteenth Day of January next ensuing; and we have given Order to our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And we do hereby further declare our Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall, on the said Thirteenth Day of January, be held, and sit for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said Thirteenth Day of January next ensuing.

Given at our Court at St. James's the Nineteenth Day of November, 1729, in the Third Year of our Reign.
