#### A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R. W Hereas our Parliament flands prorogued to the Twentieth Day of this Inflant November; we, with the Advice of our Privy Coun-cil, do hereby publish and declare. That the faid Parisament shall be further prorogued on the faid I wentieth Day of this Inflant November, to Tuef-day the Thirteenth Day of January next enfuing; and we have given Order to our Chancellor of and we have given Order to our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a Commiffion for pro-roguing the fame accordingly. And we do hereby further declare our Pleasure, That the shid Par-hament shall, on the sata Thirseenth Day of Ja-fluary, be held, and st for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citi-zens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the faid Thirteenth Day of January next ensuing.

Given at our Court at St. James's the Nineteenth Day of November, 1729, in the Third Year of our Reign.
