Asdente, an Envoy from the Republick of Genoa, is arrived here to congratulate their most Christian Majesties upon the Birth of the Dauphin. M. Denis being dead, his Office of Treasurer-General to the King's Works, is given to M. Guenebault. On the 24th Instant M. Chauvelin, Nephew to the Keeper of the Seals, was married to Made-moiselle d'Arras, and he is shortly to be re-ceived the King's Advocate-General in the Parliament, in the Room of M. d'Aguesseau. The Dutchess Dowager of Bourbon has been indisposed, but is much better. The Princess of Conti, her Daughter, is come to Paris from Isle Adam, on Occasion of the Dutchess's Illness. M. de Bombelles is made Sub-Governour to the Duke de Chartres, and the Abbot de Buisson is appointed Preceptor to that Prince. The Count de Massei, his Sardinian Majesty's Ambassadour at this Court, has been dangerously ill, but is much better. On the oth of next Month the Court will go for a Week to Marly.

A Spanish Courier arrived here this Evening from Seville, being dispatched by the Marquels de la Paz, Secretary of State to the King of Spain, with his Catholick Majesty's Letters of Notification to His Majesty, and to the Queen, upon the Birth of an Infanta, of whom the Queen of Spain was safely delivered on the 17th Instant, N. S.

This Express brought Letters of that Date from Colonel Stanhope, His Majesty's Ambassadour Extraordinary, and Mr. Keene, His

Majesty's Minister there, with an Account, that the Accession of the States General to the Treaty of Peace and Friendship, lately concluded between the Crowns of Great Britain, France and Spain, was fettled; and that it was expected that the Instruments for that Purpole would be figned in two Days by the Ministers of the respective Powers.
