It is believed M. Vander Meer Minister of the States at the Court of Spain, received about the Middle of this Month his full Powers from their High Mightinesses, by Virtue of which he will concur in the said Treaty. The Great Pensionary has been ill of the Gout and of a Fever, but is now pretty well recovered. The States of the Province of Holland are to assemble on the 9th of next Month.
