HE 19th Inftant in the Afternoon a Cannon being to be caft, his Danifh Majefty went to the Foun-dery in this City. Within the Houfe appointed for that Purpole, was a Scaffold of Sixteen or Eighteen Steps from the Floor, for the Court, where his Majefty and his Attendance ftood to fee the Perfor-mance, and befides them a Crowd of all Sorts of People had been permitted to get up up-on the fame Place. In the Middle of the Work the Mould of the Cannon burft, but did no Hurt; only the hot Metal fetting Fire to fome Parts of the Houfe where it fell, terrified the People, fo that every one pref-fing forward to fave himfelf, his Majefty was pufhed off the Scaffold as he was going to defcend the Srairs, and feveral Perfons along with him. He was presently taken up by an Officer, and convey'd to the Palace in the first Coach they found at the Door; the Heat of the Place, the Surprize, and the Vio-lence of the Fall had taken away his Sense, but by Bleeding and other proper Applica-tions he was foon recovered. His Majefty had a Bruife on his Side, fuppofed to be occa-fioned by the Hilt of his Sword, which was broke to Pieces in the Fall. The Prince Royal being otherwife engaged that Day, did not go with the King to the Foundery. As foon as the Place was clear, the Fire was eafily extinguished; and no Mischief was done, but what proceeded from the Hurry and Diforder of the Crowd. The Grand Marshal of the Court is very much hurt, but no Person of Diffinction besides. His Danish

Majesty has not stirred out of his Chamber fince the Accident; but is faid to be in good Health.
