THE 19th Instant in the Afternoon a Cannon being to be cast, his Danish Majesty went to the Foundry in this City. Within the House appointed for that Purpose, was a Scaffold of Sixteen or Eighteen Steps from the Floor, for the Court, where his Majesty and his Attendance stood to see the Performance, and besides them a Crowd of all Sorts of People had been permitted to get up upon the same Place. In the Middle of the Work the Mould of the Cannon burst, but did no Hurt; only the hot Metal setting Fire to some Parts of the House where it fell, terrified the People, so that every one pressing forward to save himself, his Majesty was pushed off the Scaffold as he was going to descend the Stairs, and several Persons along with him. He was presently taken up by an Officer, and convey'd to the Palace in the first Coach they found at the Door; the Heat of the Place, the Surprize, and the Violence of the Fall had taken away his Senses, but by Bleeding and other proper Applications he was soon recovered. His Majesty had a Bruise on his Side, supposed to be occasioned by the Hilt of his Sword, which was broke to Pieces in the Fall. The Prince Royal being otherwise engaged that Day, did not go with the King to the Foundry. As soon as the Place was clear, the Fire was easily extinguished; and no Mischiefe was done, but what proceeded from the Hurry and Disorder of the Crowd. The Grand Marshal of the Court is very much hurt, but no Person of Distinction besides. His Danish

Majesty has not stirred out of his Chamber since the Accident; but is said to be in good Health.
