Thomas Ward, Esq; His Britannick Majesty's Consul-General in the Russian Dominions, having waited on the Great Chancellor and Vice-Chancellor here, and presented his Commission; Orders have been sent by his Czarish Majesty to all the Colleges here and at St. Petersburg, to receive and acknowledge Mr. Ward in his said Character, and to pay him all the Regard and Civilities due to it, whenever he shall apply to them.

This Evening arrived one of His Majesty's Messengers, being sent Express by his Excellency Col. Stanhope, with the Act of Accession of the States General to the Treaty of Peace and Friendship that was concluded at Seville on the 9th of November last, N. S. Which Act of Accession was signed at Seville the 21st of the said Month of November, by the Ministers Plenipotentiaries of the Crowns of Great Britain, France, and Spain, and by M. van der Meer their High Mightinesses Ambassadour Plenipotentiary.
