Lisbon, January 14.

ON the 11th Instant His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Torrington, Capt. Vincent Commander, having on Board the Earl of Kinoul, put in here by contrary Winds. This Day his Lordship waited on the King and Queen of Portugal, and the Prince and Princess of Brazil, and was graciously received. His Lordship intends after some few Days Refreshment to proceed on his Voyage to Constantinople.

Hague, Jan. 31, N. S. On Friday Night last an Express was dispatch'd, by the Way of Paris, with the States General's Ratification of their Accession to the Treaty of Seville, to M. Vander Meer their High Mightinesses's Ambassadour at the Court of Spain. The States came last Week to a Resolution to fit out Twelve Men of War and Four Frigates for the Service of the current Year, which Resolution is sent to the respective Provinces for their Approbation.

Dublin, January 20.

His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales's Birth-Day has been celebrated here with all Demonstrations of publick Joy: The Great Guns were fired at the Barracks and answered by Volleys from the Regiments on Duty which were drawn out upon Oxmantown-Green. At Noon there was a numerous and splendid Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction to compliment his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant upon this Occasion. At Night there was a Play given by the Lord Lieutenant for the Entertainment of the Ladies, after which there was a Ball at the Castle.
