**O**N Thursday last a Courier arrived here with Dispatches from Brigadier Dubourgay, His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary at the Court of Berlin, dated the  $\frac{3d}{14th}$  Instant, giving an Account, that they had had Advice that Morning by Expreis from Mittau in Courland, that the Czar of Muscovy was dead of the Small Pox; and that Six of the principal Lords of Muscovy, Prince Dolgorucky being at their Head, were arrived at Mittau, to invite the Dutchels Dowager of Courland, Niece to the Czar Peter the First, to come and take upon her the Administration of the Government.
