HE King of Prussia arrived here the 18th, about Ten a-Clock at Night, attended by Count Seckendorff, General Grumkow, and two or three other Officers; he went directly to Count Truchs's, and then came to Court, and affifted at the Celebration of the Marriage of the Countes Cosel. The two Kings embraced, and fat down at Table with the Company, which confifted of about fifty Persons. After Supper there was a Ball, and the two Kings stayed till Three in the Morning. The King of Prussia lay at Count Truchs's, and the next Day his Polish Majerby prevailed upon him to accept of a Lodging in his Palace. To-morrow his Prussian Majesty fets out on his Return for Berlin.
