HIS Day the Houle of Commons of this Kingdom, attended his Ex-cellency the Lord Lieutenant at the Castle, with the following humble Address, to be transmitted to England, in order to be laid before His Majefty.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Knights Citizens and Burgeffes, in Parliament allembled.

Moft Gracious Sovereign, WE your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Commons of Ireland in Parliament affembled, beg Leave to congra-tulate your Majesty upon the happy Conclufion of an abfolute Peace with Spain; a Peace, which we doubt nor, through your Majesty's Goodnels, to reap the Benefit of in common with the reft of your Subjects : The more we think of the Miseries of a War (at best uncertain in its Event) the more we are led to admire your Majefty's Wifdom, in obtaining for us the Bleffings of Peace, and the Increase of Trade, and Riches the Confequence thereof.

As we have had, through the whole Courfe of your Majefty's Reign, many and great Instances of your Goodness towards us, we cannot omit on this Occasion, to return you our most fincere and hearty Thanks for

your conftant and unwearied Care for the Welfare and Profperity of your Subjects. Under the Government of lo good a Prince, we thall endeavour to make ourfelves an hap-py People, by taking all Opportunities of approving ourfelves your Majefty's moft dutiand loval Subjects ful and loyal Subjects.

Hague, March 14, N. S. It is expected the States of the Province of Holland will on the 16th Instant dispose of the Military Em-

ployments of their Repartition that are vacant. The Preparations for the intended Encampment in the Neighbourhood of Nimeguen, are carried on with Diligence, a great Number of Tents having been already made for the Officers and Soldiers, and all the Offi-cers are ordered to repair to their respective Regiments by the 25th of this Month. Some Companies of Swifs are to come hither, to ferve in the Room of the Foot Guards, who are to march to the Encampment, as are alfo the Horfe-Guards, who are to be relieved by fome Troops of Dragoons. Captain Schryver, who lately arrived in the Texel from the Mediterranean, with the three Men of War under his Command, has been nominated to re-turn to Algiers with two Men of War, and with the Prefents from the States General to that Government. Inftructions are drawing up for M. de Ginkel, who 'tis faid is to fet out forthwith for Berlin.

Whereas the Post Boy in carrying the Bristol Mail of Saturday last from London, was set upon and robbed by a Single Person on Foot, about Four o'Clock on Sunday I single ferfor on Foot, about Four o Clock on Sunday morning, betwist Knightsbridge and Kenfington. The Pofimafter-General thinks proper to make it publickly known, that whoever shall apprehend the Person who committed this Robbery, will, upon his Conviction be en-titled to a Reward of Two hundred Pounds, befides the Reward by Act of Parliament for apprehending of Highwaymen : Or if any one Accomplice in the Jaid Robbery shall make a Discovery of the Person who committed the Fast, fuch Accomplice will be entitled to the faid Reward of Two hundred Pounds, and also have the King's most Gracious Pardon,

The Perfon who committed this Robbery is defcribed to be a lusty Man in a dark coloured Riding Coat : He carried away all the Bags of the Mail upon the Post Horse, which was taken up in Long-acre as a Stray femetime after the Robbery.
