*Vienna, March 29, N. S.*

**S**aturday the 25th being the Feast of the Annunciation, their Imperial Majesties and the Serene Archdutchesses, attended by the Ambassadour of Venice, the Knights of the Golden Fleece, and several Ministers and Councillours of State, assisted at Divine Service in the Church of the Augustins; and in the Afternoon the Emperour, after having heard Vespers in the Jesuits Church, performed his Devotions before the Image of the Blessed Virgin. On Sunday being the Birth Day of the Archdutchess Mary Magdalen, there was a great Appearance at Court of Persons of Distinction. By the continual Rain which we have had for some Time past, and by the melting of the Snow, the Danube so overflowed its Banks on Monday last, that the Waters carried away several little Houses and Bridges. At Presburg in Hungary the Floods have likewise been so great, that the Inhabitants were obliged to make use of Boats in several Streets. Yesterday the Emperour diverted himself with Shooting near Lainz.

*Berlin, April 4, N. S.* Orders have been issued here, and the like have been sent to Prussia, Magdebourg, and all other Parts of his Prussian Majesty's Dominions, to suspend all military Preparations of any kind whatsoever. Sir Charles Hotham arrived here on Sunday Evening, and had to Day his first Audience of his Prussian Majesty at Charlottenburg.

*Dresden, April 4, N. S.* The Primate of Poland, as also the Grand Chancellor, have of late been very much indisposed, but are now on the Recovery. Several Polish Gen-

tlemen are lately arriv'd here to see the Encampment, and more are expected after the King's Return from Fraustadt, for which Place his Majesty will set out the 12th or 13th Instant, to cause the Universals for the Meeting of the Diet at Grodno to be issued out; which, according to the Laws of Poland, must begin the Monday after Michaelmas.

*Hague, April 11, N. S.* The States of Holland are to meet To-morrow, and the Great Pensionary proposes to assist in their Assembly. The States General have given the Command of the Forts about Lillo to Brigadier Godin. Captain Schryver is to put to Sea forthwith with three Men of War for Algiers, there to deliver the Presents made by this State to that Government.

*Paris, April 12, N. S.* The Court will remove from Versailles to Fontainebleau on Monday the 17th, to remain there till the 10th of June. On the 10th Instant the Court went into Mourning for the Electress Dowager of Baviere. M. Sevotier de Beau-pré is made Intendant of Chalons. On the 10th Instant in the Morning died the Marshal d'Huxelles: He is succeeded as Governour of Strasbourg by the Marshal Berwick, and by the Marshal Du Bourg as Governour of Alsace.
