Stockholm, April 1, O. S.

ON the 24th past M. d'Einfiedel arrived here from Cassel, with the News of the Death of the Landgrave of Hesse Cassel. The King of Sweden was then with the Court at Ulrichsdal, from whence his Majesty returned hither last Thursday; and the next Day a Gentleman of the Bed-chamber notified to all the Foreign Ministers, that his Majesty would receive their Compliments of Condolance on Occasion of the Death of his Serene Highness the Landgrave of Hesse Cassel on Saturday the 28th of March; and accordingly they all waited upon his Majesty on that Day: And Sunday next is appointed for the like Compliments to be made to the Queen. A great Part of the Letters of Notification to Foreign Princes were dispatch'd last Week, and the Remainder will be sent this. Letters from Moscow which came by the last Post advise, that the Felt-Marshal Galitzin, a Gentleman extremely beloved by the Army, had made his Submission, and was taken into Favour by her Czarian Majesty; that General Zollik of had been declared General in Chief, and a Relation of his of the same Name, appointed Governour of Moscow.

Hague, April 18, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland continue their Assembly, and the Pensionary assists in it every Day, pressing for the Conclusion of some of the Projects the States have before them relating to their Finances. Don Louis d'Acunha, Ambassadour from the King of Portugal, is returned from Amsterdam, having made some Proposals to the West-India Company, which are not yet accepted. This Morning we had an Account from Berlin, that the King of Prussia has named Count Degenfelt to go to England, with a Commission to his Britannick Majesty.

Paris, April 22, N. S. Sig. Mocenigo, the Venetian Ambassadour, who arrived here the 4th Instant to succeed Sig. Canale, was accompanied by the latter the 11th Instant to Versailles, where he had a private Audience of the King, the Queen, and the Dauphin. On the 17th Instant the King left Versailles at Eleven in the Morning, to lye that Night at Petitbourg, and arrive the next Morning at Fontainebleau. The Count de Sassenage, Lieutenant General of the Province of Dauphiné, died the 16th Instant. The Marshal du Bourg is arrived here from Alsace.

St. James's, April 13.

This Day M. Scutenhielm, Secretary from Sweden, had a private Audience of His Majesty, to deliver a Letter from the King his Master notifying the Death of his Father the Landgrave of Hesse-Cassel.

As had afterwards General Diemar, to deliver his new Letters of Credence, as Envoy Extraordinary from the Landgrave of Hesse-Cassel.

They were both introduced by the Right Honourable the Lord Clinton, Lord of the Bed-Chamber in waiting, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Kt. Master of the Ceremonies.

M. Scutenhielm had afterwards a private Audience of her Majesty, in her Apartment; to which he was introduced by the Right Honourable the Earl of Grantham her Majesty's Lord Chamberlain, and conducted by the Master of the Ceremonies.
