THE King of Poland is at the Encampment of Muhlberg, from whence we hear that Abundance of the Soldiers are sick, occasioned by the Wetness of the Season, and that on the Right Wing the Horse are obliged to stand in Water. His Polish Majesty is on Horseback every Morning from Three or Four a-Clock till Noon, to see his Troops perform their Exercise, with whose Performance it seems he is not entirely satisfied; and as the Time draws very near for the general Review, his Majesty has ordered all the Commanding Officers to redouble their Diligence. Prince Wiesznowski, and the Grand Marshal of Poland, are at present here to see this Place and those adjacent, but will return in a Day or two to the Encampment, whither most Persons of Distinction of this City are already gone.

Berlin, May 23, N. S. This Day at Noon the Queen of Prussia was safely delivered of a Prince.

Hague, May 30, N. S. The West India Company, and the Deputies of the Province of Zealand have come to an Agreement with Regard to a free Trade upon the Coast of Africa. The Deputies of Zealand are to return To-morrow to their Province, to have the Approbation of their Principals. The Company is to be paid a certain Sum for every Ship, according to its Bulk, trading to that Coast; and their Octroy is to be renewed for 30 Years.
