Copenhagen, May 27.

HIS Royal Highness the Prince is gone to Hirschholm ; and the Princess Sophia to Frederickshahl. His Danish Majesty is taking a Turn to Cronenburgh and Essenore, but it is not certain whether his Majesty intends to make a farther Progress this Summer, though there is some Likelihood of it, his Majesty not having as yet commissioned any one to review the Troops in Holstein. Baron Schutz, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Great Britain as Elector of Hanover, has received his Letters of Revocation, and proposes to take Leave of this Court soon after the Holidays. Baron de Ribbeck, Envoy from the King of Prussia, has received his Letters of Revocation, and is preparing to leave this Court, in order to take Possession of the Presidency of Halberstadt.

Hague, June 6, N. S. Two Regiments are named, viz. Swartzenbourg and Crommelin, to make Part of the Quota of this State pursuant to the Treaty of Seville. Admiral Perez having made good his Credentials and Powers from the Emperour of Morocco, has agreed with the States for the Redemption of the Dutch Slaves, for a Sum of about 40,000 Guilders which are to be paid at Gibraltar, to which Place the Slaves are promised to be brought and delivered up. The greatest Part of the Deputies of the States of Holland are already arrived here, to be at the Opening of their Assembly To-morrow. We have Advice, that a great Fire has lately happened at Berlin, occasioned by Lightning. The States have returned an Answer to the Letter of the King of Prussia, wherein his Majesty notified to their High Mightinesses the Marriage of his third Daughter to the Prince of Bevern. The Place of Fiscal of the Admiralty of Rotterdam being become vacant, it is thought it will be supplied by Monf. Vischer, Pensionary of the City of Harlem.
