N Sunday last the Jubilee of the Aufburgh Confession was celebrated in this City with great Decency: There was Musick suitable to the Occafion performed in all the Parish Churches; and when Divine Service was ended, the Guns upon the Ramparts were fired thrice, round the Town.

Next Tuesday both their Majesties go to a Place about five German Miles off, where the Day after they will take the Diversion of Hunting, and the next Morning his Prussian Majesty will take his Leave and continue his Leave and the Polish

Majesty will return to the Camp.
