Hambourg, June 27, N.S.

ON Sunday last the Jubilee of the Augsburg Confession was celebrated in this City with great Decency: There was Musick suitable to the Occasion performed in all the Parish Churches; and when Divine Service was ended, the Guns upon the Ramparts were fired thrice, round the Town.

Camp at Muhlberg, June 25, N.S. Friday was the last Day of the Exercises of the Troops, and last Night there was a great Firework upon the Elbe, which was followed with the Illuminations of about 30 Sloops, attended by several Gondolas and small Boats also illuminated; which Sloops fired their Cannon for an Hour or two together, and afterwards there was a fine Consort of Vocal and Instrumental Musick in a very magnificent Sloop under the Shore, where were their Polish and Prussian Majesties, and their Company; and the whole Entertainment lasted from Ten a-Clock in the Evening till between Three and Four this Morning. Next Tuesday both their Majesties go to a Place about five German Miles off, where the Day after they will take the Diversion of Hunting, and the next Morning his Prussian Majesty will take his Leave and continue his Journey to Potsdam. His Polish Majesty will return to the Camp.

Hague, July 4, N.S. The States of the Province of Holland re-assembled this Day; and the Great Pensionary was present at the Assembly. Several Ships have been taken up at Amsterdam for transporting the Troops designed for the Service of Don Carlos. We have received Advice here, that the Encampment of the King of Poland in Saxony, is broke up, and that the King of Prussia is returned to Berlin, from whence he is to set out the 10th Instant for Anspach, and thence to go to Wesel.

Windsor-Castle, June 27.

On Wednesday Morning last their Majesties, accompanied by his Royal Highness the

Prince of Wales, the Duke, the Princess Royal, and their Royal Highnesses the Princesses Amelia, Caroline, Mary, and Louisa, and attended by a great Number of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction, went to Datchet Common, where the Right Honourable the Lord Cobham's, and his Grace the Duke of Argyll's Regiments of Horse passed in Review before his Majesty, who was pleased to express his entire Satisfaction at the good Appearance the Regiments made, and with the Performance of their Exercise.
