ARON Sparre, Envoy Extraordinary from his Swedifh Majefty to the Court of Great Britain, having taken Leave of the Minifters and Senators, will take Leave to Day of the King, in order to fet out to Morrow for London. On the 14th Inftant a Jubilee was celebrated here in Commemoration of the Confeffion of Augsbourg being prefented, and accepted by the Emperour Charles V. Solemn Services in Mulick were performed in the Churches, and two general Difcharges of the Artillery were made.

Copenhagen, July 8, N. S. Yefterday the King of Denmark appeared in publick at Friedensburg, being pretty well recovered of the Swelling in his Foot. Baron Schutz, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Great Britain as Elector of Hanover, took his Audience of Leave, and had the Honour of Dining with his Majefty : He propoles to fet out in a Day or two for Harbourg.
