BARON Sparre, Envoy Extraordinary from his Swedish Majesty to the Court of Great Britain, having taken Leave of the Ministers and Senators, will take Leave to Day of the King, in order to set out to Morrow for London. On the 14th Instant a Jubilee was celebrated here in Commemoration of the Confession of Augsburg being presented, and accepted by the Emperour Charles V. Solemn Services in Musick were performed in the Churches, and two general Discharges of the Artillery were made.

Copenhagen, July 8, N. S. Yesterday the King of Denmark appeared in publick at Friedensburg, being pretty well recovered of the Swelling in his Foot. Baron Schutz, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Great Britain as Elector of Hanover, took his Audience of Leave, and had the Honour of Dining with his Majesty: He proposes to set out in a Day or two for Harbourg.

Hambourg, July 11, N. S. We have an Account here of the Death of the Duke of Courland, and that some Muscovite Troops are in Motion on one Side, and some Polish on the other, to take Possession of the Dutchy of Courland.

Hague, July 18, N. S. We have Advice that the Algerines had taken two of our East India Ships going to the Indies, having each on board 100,000 Ducatoons; and that arriving upon the Coast of Algiers, Captain Schryver, who was then in that Port, having perceived them, would have gone out to re-

take them, but could not for Want of Wind. Sir Charles Hotham, Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Great Britain to the Court of Prussia, arrived here last Night on his Return to England. The States of the Province of Holland have disposed of the Civil and Military vacant Employments in their Department.
