Hambourg, August 8, N. S.

General Lowenhorn, his Danish Majesty's Minister at the Court of Prussia, is expected here to Day or to Morrow from Berlin in his Way to Sleswick, to wait upon the King his Master. The King of Poland has sent two of his natural Sons, Count Rudowski, and the Chevalier de Saxe, to serve as Volunteers in the Imperial Army in Italy; and at the same time his Majesty has ordered Baron Lowendal to serve in that Character in the Spanish Army. On the 2d Instant Dr. Stahl passed through this City in his Way to Sleswick, where his Danish Majesty is at present, who has sent for him to consult him about his Illness. It is believed that his Danish Majesty will use the Mineral Waters at Drage, heretofore the Place of Residence of the Counts de Rantzow; and that he will afterwards make a Tour to Olderlo, and thence to Gluckstadt.

Whereas a Sum not exceeding Fifteen Hundred Pounds was granted to His Majesty in the last Session of Parliament, upon Account of one Year's Pensions from the 25th Day of December 1729, to be allowed to the Widows of such Half Pay Officers of the Land Forces, as served and were married before the 25th Day of December 1716. Now to the End that a proper List may be prepared for His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual for the Distribution of the said Sum of Fifteen Hundred Pounds, It is His Majesty's Pleasure, That all such Widows as shall desire to partake thereof, as entitled by the Descriptions above mentioned, shall and do before the 29th Day of September next, bring and deliver at the Office of His Majesty's Secretary at War in Whitehall, a Certificate signed by two or more credible Persons, in the Form or to the Effect following, viz.

" We do hereby certify, that we verily believe that A. B. Widow, now residing in _____ is the Widow of _____ who did serve as an Officer of the Land Forces before the 25th of December 1716, and that she was married to him before that Time; and that her said Husband died upon the British Establishment of Half Pay in Quality of _____ on or about the _____ Day of _____ and that to the best of our Belief she still continues the Widow of the said Officer, without any Provision from the Government either in Great Britain or Ireland To which Certificate such Widow shall make Oath before one or more of his Majesty's Justice or Justices of the Peace, that the Contents of the said Certificate are true, and such Oath to be subscribed by such Justice or Justices before whom it shall be made.
