COUNT Potofzky, the Nephew of the Primate of Poland, arrived here some Days ago. Her Majesty the Czarina returned from her Pilgrimage to Troitza at Ismailoff the 8th Instant, in perfect Health.

Dresden, Aug. 12, N. S. On Thursday Evening last the Countess Ozelka was married to a Prince of Holstein Beck; all the Foreign Ministers residing here were present at the Celebration of the Nuptials. The King's Journey to Warsaw stands fixed for the 16th Instant.

Stefwick, Aug. 13. His Danish Majesty has been a little indisposed for these few Days past, but is at present better; and 'tis hoped that his Indisposition will go off. General Lowenhorn, his Danish Majesty's Minister at the Court of Prussia, arrived here the 11th Instant from Berlin.

Windfor-Castle, August 10, 1730.

Whereas two Letters, one subscribed Jon. H. and Tho. J. dated the 5th Instant, and the other subscribed Jon. Resolute, dated the 7th, have been received, by the Penny-Post, by Nathaniel Gould, Esq; one of the Directors of the Bank of England, directed to him at his House in Crosby-Square in Bishopsgate-street, requiring him to come alone to Constitution-Hill and leave Ten Guineas in a Purse under three Bricks which he should find together, within three Yards of the Corner of the Wall of her Grace the Dutchess of Buckingham's Garden, and threatening, in Case of Refusal, or of endeavouring to betray the Person that should come to see if

the Money were there, pursuant to their Demand, that he the said Nathaniel Gould should not long survive. His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in sending the said Letters, or either of them, is pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices, so as he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And as a further Encouragement to such Discovery, the said Nathaniel Gould does hereby promise, that whoever shall discover the Person or Persons who sent, or contrived or directed the sending of the said Letters, or either of them, so as he or they may be convicted thereof, shall, upon such Conviction, receive as a Reward, the Sum of Fifty Pounds of him the said Nathaniel Gould.
