HE Elector of Cologne and Prince Theodore his Brother are still here, but defign to be gone To-morrow. They have leen what is most remar-kable in this Place and its Neighbourhood. They were Yetterday entertained at Dinner by his Excellency the Earl of Chefterfield; and at Night went to a Ball at a Country Seat a League from hence.

Windfor-Cafile, August 31. Yesterday the Chevalier Ollorio, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Sardinia, reteived a Courier from his Court, with an Ac-count that his Sardinian Majesty had religned his Crown, etc. to the Prince of Piement his Son, and defigned to retire to his Caffle of Chamberry in Savoy; and this Day the Chev. Ollorio had an Audience of his Ma-Jesty, at which he presented his Credential Letters from the prefent King to His Majefty.

Windfor-Castle, August 37. On the 24th Instant one of His Majesty's Messengers arrived here from Spain, being dispatched by Mr. Keens His Majesty's Mir nister at that Count, with his Catholick Majefty's Cedula for the South Sea Company's
