Whereas two Letters, one subscribed Jon. H. and Tho. J. dated the 5th Instant, and the other subscribed Jon. Resolute, dated the 7th, have been received, by the Penny-Post, by Nathaniel Gould, Esq; one of the Directors of the Bank of England, directed to him at his House in Crosby-Square in Bishopsgate-street, requiring him to come alone to Constitution-Hill and leave Ten Guineas in a Purse under three Bricks which he should find together, within three Yards of the Corner of the Wall of her Grace the Dutchess of Buckingham's Garden, and threatening, in Case of Refusal, or of endeavouring to betray the Person that should come to see if the Money were there, pursuant to their Demand, that he the said Nathaniel Gould should not long survive. His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in sending the said Letters, or either of them, is pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices, so as he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And as a further Encouragement to such Discovery, the said Nathaniel Gould does hereby promise, that whoever shall discover the Person or Persons who sent, or contrived or directed the sending of the said Letters, or either of them, so as he or they may be convicted thereof, shall, upon such Conviction, receive as a Reward, the Sum of Fifty Pounds of him the said Nathaniel Gould.

Whereas the Post-Boy bringing the Bristol Mail to London, was set upon and Robbed by a single Person on Foot, about Nine o'Clock last Night, half a Mile before he came to Maidenhead; The Post-Master General thinks proper to make it publicly known, that whoever shall apprehend the Person who committed this Robbery, will, upon his Conviction be entitled to a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds, besides the Reward by Act of Parliament for apprehending of Highwaymen: Or if any one Accomplice in the said Robbery shall make a Discovery of the Person who committed the Fact, such Accomplice will be entitled to the said Reward of Two hundred Pounds, and also have the King's most Gracious Pardon.
