Copenhagen, September 12, N. S.

THE Court remains still at Odenfee, tho' his Danish Majesty, it is said, would gladly come hither, if he was able to remove. The Swelling begins to shift from his Leg and mount upwards, increasing daily, and it is feared will turn to a Dropsy. An Express came hither a few Days ago for one of his Majesty's Physicians, who is gone to attend his Majesty.

Hague, Sept. 19, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland have resumed their Assembly to Day, and the Grand Pensionary has presented to them new Projects relating to the Finances. The Commissioners named to settle the new Taxes on Houses, set out to Morrow to enter upon the Execution of their Commission. M. Marsh is arrived here from the King of Prussia, to succeed M. Meynertzhagen lately deceased, and this Day he delivered his Credentials to the President of the States. The Directors of the East India Company having had several Conferences with the Deputies of the States relating to the two East India Ships returned from Algiers, were dismissed, it being left to their Liberty to act in that Affair as they shall think most beneficial for the Service of the Company. Letters from Captain Schryver advise, that he has taken and brought to Cadiz a Sallee Brigantine of 18 Guns and 80 Men, and retaken a Dutch Ship which the Brigantine had made a Prize of.
