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Edinburgh, July 1.

THe Scotch Privateers have lately brought three Dutch Prizes into *Leith*, one laden with Sugars, Indigo, &c. from the *West Indies*, another of 600 Tuns, laden with Victuals, and the third with Ammunition, both designed from *Holland* to meet their *East India* Fleet.

Harwich, July 3. The *Dartmouth* Frigate hath this day brought in here a Dutch Merchant man belonging to *Flushing*, Mounted with 12 or 14 Guns, and laden with Sugars from the *West Indies*, which they took going into the *Texel*.

Copenhagen, June 18. On Wednesday the 12 instant, his Grace the Duke of *Richmond*, Extraordinary Ambassador from His Majesty of *Great Britain*, made his publick Entry here, having been received and Complimented on the part of the King, by Monsieur *Skjel*, a Nobleman of great Authority in this Court, and Monsieur *Kraegh* Master of the Ceremonies, about a mile out of Town, and so conducted hither in his Majesties Coach, attended by great numbers of Coaches, as well of the Queen, Prince *George*, as of the several Nobility here, all with six Horses apiece; at his Excellencies coming into the Town, all the great Guns were discharged from the Walls, and the Soldiery drawn up in their Arms, with all other publick demonstrations of an extraordinary respect to his Excellencies Person and Quality; his Grace's Train and Equipage was most Noble and Splendid, consisting of three very rich Coaches with six Horses apiece, twelve Footmen, and eight Pages, besides Grooms and Trumpeters, who were all in very rich Liveries. On Friday his Excellency after having been four Meals very splendidly entertained at the Kings charge, had his publick Audience of the King, Queen, and Prince, whither he was conducted in the same manner as is above-mentioned.

Paris, July 9. You will certainly have already heard of the taking of *Doesburgh*, *Zutphen*, &c. yet notwithstanding, we will not omit giving you an Account of the following Particulars, which we receive from the Camp at *Biloin*, between *Aernhem* and *Doesburgh*; That the 19 past the Duke of *Roanet*, opened the Trenches before *Doesburgh*, with the loss of few Men, though with great danger to himself, four Gentlemen having been killed on his side, and he himself receiving a Musket Shot through his Hat; The 21 as they were going to Storm the place, the Inhabitants sent out to Capitulate, and obtained, that they should all be undisturbed in their Persons and Estates, onely that the Garrison which was 4000 Foot, and 100 Horses, should be Prisoners at War, upon which they presently yielded; nor any Persons of Note were killed at this Siege, save the Marquis de *Barreylet*, who was killed with a Canon Bullet. The same day being the 21, Count *Conningmark*, Ambassador Extraordinary from the Crown of *Sweden*, had Audience of his Majesty, to which he was introduced with the usual Ceremonies. The 22 his Majesty received advice of the ta-

king of *Deventer*; by the Forces of the Bishop of *Munster*; and that *Swol*, *Kampen*, *Elbourg*, *Arderswyck*, *Karrem*, *Hasselt*, and *Ommen*, had all yielded upon the Summons of a single Trumpeter, and accordingly, after having driven out the Dutch, received French Garrisons. The 23 his Majesty had an Account of the taking of the Forts of *Voorne*, and *St. Andre*, two very considerable Posts in the County of *Bammel*, who both yielded upon the approach of 300 Horse onely, which the Viscount *Turenne* had sent thither, under the Command of the Sieur d' *Apremons*; The 24 his Majesty sent a Reinforcement to the Duke of *Orleans*, who besieged *Zutphen*; The same day the Bishop of *Strasbourg* arrived in the Camp, and had Audience of the King; The next day the Bishop of *Munster* arrived there likewise, having been presented to his Majesty by the Sieur de *Banneil*, with whom he had a long Conference, after which, he again took his leave, in order to his return to his Army, having been presented by his Majesty with a cross of Diamonds of a very great value. The same day the Baron de *Metemich*, Envoy from the Elector of *Treves*, had likewise Audience of the King; The same day the Duke de *Roanet* parted with three Squadrons of Horse for *Utrecht*, and the Viscount *Turenne*, after having Dined with the King, returned to *Nimwegen*, which place holds out still with much obstinacy. At ten that night his Majesty received the news of the Surrender of *Zutphen* upon conditions, That the Governor with the whole Garrison, in all 3000 Foot, and 250 Horse, should be Prisoners at War, &c. The 27 his Majesty parted from *Biloin* towards *Amerongen*, where he intended to incamp, his Majesty having before ordered the Duke of *Vendosmes* Regiment to be put into *Aernhem*; The 28 his Majesty arrived at *Amerongen*. It is said his Majesty intends to go the 30 instant for *Utrecht*, which is onely four Leagues from thence. The 29 the Marshal *Turenne* intended to open the Trenches before *Nimwegen*, not doubting but in a short time to make himself Master of that place. The same day the 28 the Sieur de *Groot* arrived in the Camp, with ample power from the States General, and was the next day to have Audience of his Majesty. The third instant the Dutchels d' *Enguien* was happily brought to Bed of a Son at *St. Germain*, to the great joy of that Family. At *Belde Isle* is arrived the Ship called the *Crowned Dauphin*, from *Suratte*, from whence she came in *January* last; we have advice, that about the same time the Sieur de la *Haye* parted thence with his Squadron on some great design for the advancement of Trade, and that the King of *Tonquin* had granted the French great immunities, with liberty to Trade and Traffick in any of his Territories.

Amsterdam, July 5. Here hath been great confusion this week, the Heer *Hasselaer* our Chief Sheriff, was some days since wounded in a Tumult by a Musket Shot; and the Burgermaster de *Graef*, as he was going to the *Hague*, to be present there in the Assembly of the States of *Holland*, on the part of this Town, was very severely fallen upon by the peo-
