**N**OTICE has been given to those Foreign Ministers who have Affairs to regulate with the Republick, that the Conferences with them, which were appointed to be resumed about this Time, are put off on Account of the Absence of several of the Commissioners, till the Opening of the Dyet at Grodno. On the 4th Instant the Palatin of Kyovia gave a great Entertainment and Ball, on Occasion of the Birth of the Prince in Saxony, to which a great Number of Persons of Distinction, and all the Foreign Ministers were invited. It happened to be the Anniversary of the Birth of the Dauphin, which he celebrated with great Magnificence last Year, being nearly related to her most Christian Majesty. The Primate being a little recovered from a Fit of the Gout, has taken his Leave of the King, and is gone into the Country to prepare himself for the Dyet to be held at Grodno. The Grand Chancellor has already begun his Journey thither, but we hear that when he crossed the Vistula, he found himself in so weak a Condition, that he has been obliged to stop at Prague to rest himself for a short Time.

Hambourg, Sept. 22, N. S. We have had a Report here of the King of Denmark's Death, but it proves groundless; and by the Letters from Odensee we are informed, that his Majesty has found some Ease by the Medicines which have been given him by Dr. Fecht. However they add, that his Majesty is still in a weak Condition.
