IT is said the Grand Vizier has sent a very able Person along with the Persian Ambassadors to Schack Thamas, to endeavour to prevent a War, and to persuade him to confirm the Treaty which was made with those Ambassadors here; and that the Vizier has likewise given Orders to the Basha of Babylon to do all that lies in his Power to terminate these Differences between the Porte and the Persians in an amicable Manner. The Vizier will not begin his March from Scutari to Aleppo till the Beginning of September next; before that Time he expects an Answer from Persia, and will regulate himself according to the Advices he shall receive from thence. 'Tis reckoned to be a March of 56 Days from Scutari to Aleppo, so that he cannot be at Aleppo before the Beginning of November at soonest. In case of a War, he will winter at Aleppo, and march with his Army to the Frontiers of Persia early in the Spring. It is likewise said, that if there is a War, the Grand Signior will go with his Army as far as Cognia, which is about half Way to Aleppo, and stay there during the Winter, and in the Spring proceed to the Frontiers, as there shall be Occasion for his Presence, with the Army. He will keep about 20000 Men with himself, and send the rest with the Vizier.

Hague, Oct. 3, N. S. Admiral Perez having received new Credentials from the present King of Morocco, and delivered them to the States, is now acknowledged here as Mi-

nister of that King. M. March, the new Prussian Minister, has taken Possession of the late King William's House called the Old Court, in which M. Meigertshagen dwelt for some Time. General Hompesch set out from hence some Days ago for Boileduc, of which he is Governour. The States of the Province of Holland separated on Saturday last. During their Session a new Project was communicated to them by the Grand Pensionary for laying a Family Tax, different from one of that kind which they have had for some Time under Consideration. The Prince of Nassau Siegen set out this Morning for Brussels, with a Design of returning hither in a short Time to prosecute his Pretensions to some Part of the Estate left by the late King William. The Directors of the East-India Company, pursuant to the Liberty given them by the States, have dismissed the Crews of their two Ships taken and released by the Algerines from their Service. The Lord Baltimore and his Lady arrived here two Days ago, and design to go to see Amsterdam and Utrecht.
