Moscow, September 3, O. S.

THE 30th of last Month being St. Alexander's Day, all the Knights of that Order, as well as the Foreign Ministers, were invited to Court, and had the Honour to dine with her Czarish Majesty, who gave General Weisbach the Order of St. Alexander, as well as to Prince Chercasky, Felt Marshal Trubetzkoj, and Count Wratiflaus. At Night there was a great Supper at Court, and a fine Firework. That Day is always solemnized with great Pomp, not only because Peter the First instituted the Order of St. Alexander, but also because it was the Day that the Peace was signed at Nieustadt between the Muscovites and the Swedes. General Weisbach set out Yesterday for Poland, being named her Czarish Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary at the Diet of Grodno. Her Majesty is raising a new Regiment of Foot Guards, which is to be composed of 2000 Gentlemen, and Major General Count Leuenvolde is appointed Colonel. All the Officers are to be Livonians or Foreigners; they are to be called the Third Regiment of her Majesty's Body Guards, being to take Rank after the Preobrasnsky and Simeneoffsky Guards. Prince Charbatoff, who was the Czarina's Minister in Spain, is to go with the same Character to Berlin; from whence Prince Gallitzen is soon to return hither.

Warsaw, Sept. 23, N. S. M. Potocky, the Primate's Nephew, is arrived here from Moscow, having been sent thither some Months ago by the Primate, to compliment her Czarish Majesty upon her Accession to the Crown, that Family being nearly related to her. The Czarina has conferred upon

him the Order of St. Andrew, and made him a Present of 5000 Ducats, besides several other things to a considerable Value. He relates that that Country is in great Tranquility, and her Czarish Majesty very much beloved by her Subjects. The Duke of Courland and the Duke of Weissenfelds have both asked his Polish Majesty's Consent for the former's marrying a Niece of the latter, which his Majesty has granted; so it is thought that Marriage will be soon concluded. The Duke of Courland is now very desirous of doing Homage to the King of Poland, and has appointed M. Bulow, who was formerly a Deputy from the Nobility at this Court, to perform the Ceremony for him, which, it is said, will be during the Diet. The King of Poland set out for Grodno this Afternoon, and the Primate, who arrived here last Night, and had a long Audience of his Majesty this Morning, will set out to Morrow.

Warsaw, Oct. 3, N. S. The Marquess de Monti, Ambassadour from the most Christian King, and the Pope's Nuncio, are gone for Grodno; from whence we have received Advice, that the King arrived there safe the 30th of last Month.

Dresden, Oct. 10, N. S. The Count de Watzdorp has been nominated by his Polish Majesty to go to the Court of Great Britain with the Character of Envoy Extraordinary, and he will set out forthwith.
