St. James's, November 2. HIS Day Baron Sohlenthal had a private Audience of His Majefty, to notify the Death of the late King of Denmark, and deliver his Letter of Credence as Envoy Extraor-

dinary from the prefent King, to which he was introduced by the Right Honourable the Lord Harrington one of His Majetty's Principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Kt. Mafter of the Ceremonies.

He had afterwards a private Audience of Her Majefty, to which he was introduced by the Right Ho-nourable the Earl of Grantham Her Majefty's Lord Chamberlain, and conducted by the Mafter of the Ceremonies.

Whereas in the Month of September last several Letters were fent to Mr. George Packer, of the City of Bri-Rol, Merchant, and one to his Sifters who lived in his House, requiring that a certain Sum of Money should be left in particular Places described in the faid Letters, shreatning, if the fame were not complied with, to murther them, and to burn his Houfe, and accordingly on Saturday the 3d of Offober Inflant, about Twelve of the Clock at Night, bis faid Houfe was let on Fire, and entirely confumed, whereby the Ships at the Key and the whole City were in great Danger of being allo fet on Fire ; and fince the burning of the faid Houfe, two Letters have been conveyed to the faid Mr. Packer, threatning, if he did not leave a larger Sum of Money at a Place appointed, to murther h m and his Sifters, to burn every Houfe he should live in, and that the City before it were long, bould be all in Flames : For the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person concerned in a Crime of so high a Nature, and attende l with fo much Barbarity and Villany, His Majefty is pleafed to promife His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices, so as he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof; and also a Reward of One Hundred Pounds to fuch Person, or to any other Person or Perfons making fuch Discovery as also esaid, payable upon the Conviction of Jack Offinder or Offenders,

And as a further Encouragement to fuch Difcovery, the Mavor, Ald. tmen, and Common Council of the City of Bristol, do hereby promise, That whoever shall discover the Person or Persons who sent, or contrived or directed the fending the faid Letters, or any of them, or was or were concerned in sctting Fire to the said House, or fent, contrived or directed the sending any Letter or Letters fince the burning the sa d House, to the said Mr. Packer or others, demanding Money as aforefaid, fo as he or they may be convicted thereof, (hall, upon Juch Conviction, receive as a Reward the Sum of TWO Hundred Pounds of the suid City, to be paid by the Chamberlain of the said City, over and above all Rewards already offered. W Hereas Complaint hath been made to this VV Court, That great Numbers of loofe and diforderly Perfons do often affemble themfelves at the Place and Times of Execution of the Condemned Malefactors, and that the proper Officers appointed to attend fuch Executions are frequently infulted and molefted in the Performance of their Duty: And that the faid Officers who are ordered to affift the Perfons appointed by the Company of Barbers and Surgeons in cartying a Dead Body of the Malefactors to their Hall to be Diffected, according to the Act of Parliament, for the Instruction of the Members of the faid Company in the Science of Anatomy, are frequently abused and infulted, and are sometimes prevented from carrying away fuch Dead Body, as afore-faid This Court does therefore order, That the faid Under Sheriff of Middlefex, and the Officers of the two Compters, who are to attend to fee the Execution performed, do take special Care to prevent any fuch Diffurbances and Infults : And that they affift the Officers of the faid Company of Barbers and Surgeons in carrying away the Dead Bodies to their Hall. And that if any Person or Perfons do in any manner oppofe or hinder the carrying away any fuch Body, That the faid Officers do feize and apprehend fuch Perfon or Perfons, and carry him or them before a Magisfrate, to be dealt with according to Law. And if any Persons, to the Number of Twelve or more, shall obftrußt or hinder the faid Officers in their Duty, that then the Under-Sheriff of Middlefex shall read the Proclamation in the Act of the First of King George the First, to disperse such a disorderly Per-sons. And if they continue together in such diforderly Manner for the Space of an Hour after fuch Proclamation, That then the faid Officers do apprehend fuch Offenders, and carry them before fome Magistrate, to be dealt with according to And it is further ordered, That this Order Law be printed and published in some of the publick News Papers, and affixed at Newgate, the Place of Execution, and other publick Places within this City and Liberties thereof.
