THE Court removed two Days ago from Fredericksberg to a Palace in this City, where his Majesty lived when Prince Royal; not intending, as it is supposed, to go into the Royal Habitation till the Mourning is over. The Princess Sophia is come to Charlottenberg, her own House in this City, where she proposes for the future to reside. 'Tis believed the King will not give any Audience in Publick till after the Funeral, the Day for which is not yet fixed, nor the Time for going into Mourning, though the Manner of it is already prescribed.

Hague, Nov. 28, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland broke up their Assembly on Friday last, which they will resume again about the Middle of next Month, having examined the Project communicated to them for the State of War next Year. The Prince of Nassau Frise continues here, and has as yet fixed no Time for his Departure. The Marquess de Fenelon is expected here on Friday next.
