Warsaw, November 22, N. S.

THE Primate, and the Regimentary Count Poniatowski, are lately come to Town, and design to pass some Time here. This being the Anniversary of the Princess of Holstein's Birthday, there will be a Ball at Court in the Evening, to which all the Foreign Ministers are invited. M. Lewold, Adjutant General in the Emperour's Service, is expected here very soon from Vienna, his Baggage being already arrived. We have had here a very hard Frost for some Days past, but it is thought too soon in the Year to hold.

Copenhagen, Nov. 28, N. S. On the 26th Instant the Court went into deep Mourning for the deceased King. But though his Danish Majesty has begun to appear in publick, he has not yet given Audiences; and it is believed he would willingly defer giving any for a while, till the Funeral is over, and the Home Affairs of the Kingdom, in which his Majesty is constantly employed, are regulated and settled.

St. James's, December 7.

This Day Count Watzdorff, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Poland, had his first private Audience of His Majesty, to deliver his Letter of Credence; to which he was introduced by the Right Honourable the Lord Harrington one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Kt. Master of the Ceremonies.

He had afterwards a private Audience of the Queen, in Her Majesty's Apartment; to which he was introduced by the Right Honourable the Earl of Grantham Her Majesty's Lord Chamberlain, and conducted by the Master of the Ceremonies.
