GOD Save the KING.

Seville, Dec. 1. Their Catholick Majesties, and the rest of the Royal Family, continue in perfect Health at the Alcazar of this City. On the 25th past Arthur Stert and John Goddard, Esqrs. His Britannick Majesty's Commissaries, arrived here, and have been introduced to Sig. Patinno by the British Minister at this Court. The Marquess de la Paz has been indisposed for some Days past, but is pretty well recovered.

St. James's, December 8.

Count Watzdorff, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Poland, had this Day his first private Audience of his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales; to which he was introduced by Sir Clement Cottrell, Kt. Master of the Ceremonies.

He had afterwards a private Audience of his Royal Highness the Duke, being introduced by the Master of the Ceremonies.

St. James's, Dec. 9. This Day Count Watzdorff, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Poland, had a private Audience of Her Royal Highness the Princess Royal, and their Royal Highnesses the Princesses Amelia and Caroline; to which he was introduced by the Master of the Ceremonies.
