W HEREAS our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the Seventeenth Day of this Instant December; we, with the Advice of our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, That the said Parliament thall be further prorogued on the said Seven-teenth Day of December, to Thursday the Twenty First Day of January next ensuing; and we have given Order to our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And we do hereby further declare our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall, on the said Twenty First Parliament shall, on the laid Twenty First Day of January next, be held, and sit for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons are hereby required to give their Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said Twenty First Day of Langary next.
