A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the Seventeenth Day of this Instant December; we, with the Advice of our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, That the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said Seventeenth Day of December, to Thursday the Twenty First Day of January next ensuing; and we have given Order to our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And we do hereby further declare our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall, on the said Twenty First Day of January next, be held, and sit for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons are hereby required to give their Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said Twenty First Day of January next.

Given at our Court at St. James's the Fourteenth Day of December, 1730. in the Fourth Year of our Reign.

St. James's, December 22.

Sir Cyril Wich, Bart. His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary to the Hanse Towns, having obtained the King's Leave to come over to England on his private Affairs, arrived here on Sunday last, and waited Yesterday on their Majesties, who received him very graciously; and this Day was introduced to his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, and to his Royal Highness the Duke.

His Majesty has also been pleased to issue his Letter Mandatory to the President and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Litchfield, recommending unto them Nicholas Peany, Doctor of Divinity, to be chosen into the Place of Dean of the said Cathedral, void by the Death of Dr. William Walmisley.
