A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

**W**HEREAS Henry Earl of Deloraine was duly elected and returned to be one of the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, to sit in the House of Peers of this present Parliament of Great Britain, and is since deceased; In order to the electing another Peer of Scotland to sit in his Room, we do, by the Advice of our Privy Council, issue forth this our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at Holyrood-House in Edinburgh, on Friday the Nineteenth Day of February next ensuing, between the Hours of Twelve and Two in the Afternoon, to nominate and choose another Peer of Scotland in the Room of the said Henry Earl of Deloraine deceased, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the Proxies of such as shall be absent, such Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in Writing duly signed before Witnesses, and both the Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law. And the Lord Clerk Register, or such Two of the Principal Clerks of the Session, as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his Name, are hereby respectively required to attend such Meeting, and to administer the Oaths required by Law to be

taken there by the said Peers, and to take their Votes; and immediately after such Election made, and duly examined, to certify the Name of the Peer so elected, and sign and attest the same in Presence of the said Peers, and return such Certificate into our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain. And we strictly charge and command, that this our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market-Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the County-Towns of Scotland, Twenty five Days at least before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the said Peers to proceed to such Election.

*Moscow, Dec. 10.* Her Czarish Majesty has had a slight Indisposition, but is at present entirely recovered of it. Yesterday M. de Westphalen, Envoy Extraordinary from Denmark, had an Audience of her Czarish Majesty, at which he imparted to her the Death of the late King his Master, and the Prince Royal of Denmark's Accession to the Throne; and at the same Time delivered to her Imperial Majesty a Letter from the present King on those Occasions. The Court will go into Mourning for six Weeks for the Death of the said Prince. This Day will be celebrated at the Palace the Festival of St. Andrew, and all the Knights of that Order are invited in the Evening to a splendid Entertainment.

*Warsaw, Dec. 27, N. S.* We hear that the Prince Emanuel of Portugal, and the Duke de Liria, have passed through Mittau in their Way hither, and the Baggage of the latter is already arrived, so that they are both expected every Hour. Yesterday his Majesty reviewed some Squadrons of Horse of his Saxon Troops which are here. The new Cham of the Tartars has sent hither an Aga, who has been permitted to come into the Country without performing Quarantine: But tho' he has passed through Wallachia, where there is no Infection, yet he is lodged by himself with his Retinue till such Time as we are assured that they are in a good State of Health.

*Hague, Jan. 7, N. S.* The Commissioners of the Admiralties have been here these three or four Days, and have had several Conferences with the States upon the intended Naval Force for this Year. All the Military Officers are ordered to be with their respective Regiments by the 25th of March next, and all the Captains to have their Companies compleat by that Time, under Pain of being cashiered. The States had an Account Yesterday of the Death of General de Montezé, Governour of Tournay. There are already several Competitors for that Government.
