PROCLAMATION. Α

GEORGE R.

HEREAS Henry Earl of Deloraine was duly elected and re-turned to be one of the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, to fit in the Houle of Peers of this prefent Parliament of Great Britain, and is fince deceased; In order to the electing another Peer of Scotland to fit in his Room, we do, by the Advice of our Privy Councel, iffue forth this our Royal Proclamation, ftrictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to affemble and meet at Holyrood-Houle in Edinburgh, on Friday the Nineteenth Day of February next enfuing, between the Hours of Twelve and Two in the Afternoon, to nominate and choofe another Peer of Scotland in the Room of the faid Henry Earl of Deloraine deceafed, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the Proxies of such as shall be absent, such Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in Writing duly figned before Witneffes, and both the Conflituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law. And the Lord Clerk Register, or such Two of the Principal Clerks of the Selfion, as thall be appointed by him to officiate in his Name, are hereby refpective-ly required to attend fuch Meeting, and to administer the Oaths required by Law to be ning to a splendid Entertainment.

taken there by the faid Peers, and to take their Votes; and immediately after fuch Election made, and duly examined, to certify the Name of the Peer fo elected, and fign and attest the fame in Prefence of the faid Peers, and return fuch Certificate into our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain. And we strictly charge and command, that this our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market-Crois at Edinburgh, and in all the County-Towns of Scotland, Twenty five Days at leaft before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the faid Peers to pro-ceed to fuch Election.
