Warsaw, January 3.

THE Duke de Liria, Ambassadour from Spain, who lately arrived here from Moscow, has had the Honour to wait on the King, who received him with great Marks of Distinction, and has given Orders to his Officers to attend him during his Stay here. The Minister lately come from the Cham of the Tartars will have soon his publick Audience of the King.

Copenhagen, Jan. 12, N. S. The King has ordered that the Officers of the reduced Regiments shall be employed in other Regiments as Vacancies happen, and in the mean time they are to enjoy their Pay. On the 8th his Majesty held a Council, and afterwards dined in publick. M. Wiebe, Viceroy of Norway, is continued in that Post for three Years. M. Scheffedt, who is expected in a little Time from France, having been nominated President of the Privy Council, will immediately upon his Return hither take Possession of that Employment.

Stockholm, Jan. 7. The Admiralty have sent Orders to the Marine Officers to repair to Carelscoon and reside there, and to recall thither the absent Sailors. The Deputies of Finland are charged, among other Things, to thank the King for having been pleased to cause Granaries to be erected in divers Places of that Province; by which his Majesty has not only procured Plenty, but will for the future prevent Scarcity in case of a bad Harvest, because those Granaries are sufficiently provided for two Years; and what is consumed one Year out of them, is to be replaced the next.

Hague, Jan. 19, N. S. This Republick is about to make a new Augmentation of their Forces with 10000 Men more. The Province of Holland has declared for this Augmentation, and it is not at all doubted the other Provinces will concur, as soon as their Consent shall be required in the usual Forms. The said States of Holland have likewise passed a Resolution to take in a Loan of Six Millions of Florins, for defraying their extraordinary Expences; and have written to the other Provinces to do the like. The Prince of Nassau Friseland has been very ill of the Measles in Friseland, but is much better, and thought to be out of Danger. Prince William of Hesse Cassel, his Uncle, is expected here in a few Days.

Hague, Jan. 23, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland continue their Assembly, and in all Probability will not separate this Week, by Reason of the weighty Affairs that are still before them. The Scheme for augmenting the Troops of this State with 10000 Men, goes forward. General Hompesch and other General Officers who are absent, have received Orders to repair forthwith hither, to assist at the Conferences which are to be held relating to Military Affairs. Letters from Moscow of the 28th of last Month advise, that Prince Galitzin, Felt-Marshal General of the Russian Troops, was dead there, univerversally regretted, by reason of his great Experience in Military Affairs. They add, that the Journey which the Court was going to take to Petersbourg, was suspended, an Embassy from the new Sultan of the Turks being expected at Moscow.
